SSE Thermal invites you to view plans and share feedback on its proposed Ferrybridge Hydrogen project.

SSE Thermal's Ferrybridge site in West Yorkshire holds a proud place in the UK's power generation story and is an ideal location for new technologies like hydrogen production.

In line with our commitment to deliver a low carbon future, we are proposing to build and operate a 50MW green hydrogen production facility at the site.

The project, known as Ferrybridge Hydrogen, will use renewable power to produce hydrogen which will be used by local and regional hard-to-abate businesses helping to decarbonise industries such as glass, construction materials and chemical manufacturers.

The proposed project, which could be one of the first green hydrogen plants in the UK, will provide a scalable solution for industry, helping to safeguard local jobs and businesses for decades to come.
